Commemoration:

This event will take place on Sunday October 28th at the Famine Rock Memorial at Williamstown, Victoria.

Dr Perry McIntyre, GIFCC Vice-Chair and Trish Power, GIFCC Hon Secretary, will be attending.

Committee report:

It has been a busy year for the Committee and has included PR and marketing at the St Patrick's Day event and two well-attended fund-raisers at History House, headquarters of the Royal Australian Historical Society. Work has proceeded on updating the website, establishing the GIF/WSU Refugee Scholarship, increasing our membership - currently about 160 members of which 100 are currently financial. We urge you to update your membership annually, i.e. pay your \$5 prior to June 30th for the following year. This membership fee of \$5 helps us defray costs, entitles you to a discount on events and you are eligible to vote at the AGM!! We are indebted to the Irish Government Emigrant Support Programme for their financial assistance of our website development and maintenance costs. Further work is required before the new website goes on-line. We are also appreciative of the assistance and guidance of Scott Lyall, WSU Business Development Manager, in establishing the GIF/WSU Refugee Scholarship and also assisting in planning a Major Donor event being planned for April/May 2019.

In August 2019 we will be celebrating our 20th year of Annual Gatherings since the Governor General, Sir William Deane, unveiled the Monument in August 1999.

Dr Perry McIntyre continues to work diligently on our ever-expanding Orphan Database and is currently working to upload to the new website.

Excerpts from the *Illustrated London News*Vol 10 Jan - June 1847 - "Chronicle of Remarkable Events, December 21 1846 to July 1, 1847"

January 1 - Subscription opened for the relief of distress in Ireland and Scotland; headed by the Queen (Victoria) for 2000 pounds.

January 5 - Large purchases of Indian Corn made on the Continent for supply of Ireland.

January 11 - Alarming Food Riots in Dublin.

January 13 - Lamentable famine in the County of Cork.

January 16 - The Pope contributed 250 pounds to the Relief of the Distressed Irish.

January 18 - Lamentable distress at Bantry; 10 persons died of starvation.

January 19 - The Distress in Ireland and Scotland (etc) were the main topics of the Speech at the opening of Parliament by her Majesty in person.

January 22 - Frightful famine and fever at Skibbereen.

January 25 - Lord John Russell proposed to Parliament his measure for the Relief of Ireland.

January 27 - Lloyd's books showed the recent loss of many grain ships on the west coast of Ireland.

January 30 - (New York) - large sum of money raised there for the distressed Irish.
