Great Irish Famine Refugee Scholarship Fund

The Great Irish Famine Commemoration Committee has established a Great Irish Famine Refugee Scholarship to support a refugee student currently attending Western Sydney University. This scholarship recognises all people who died or emigrated as a result of the Great Irish Famine (an Gorta Mór, 1845-1850) and acknowledges Irish Famine immigrants who settled in Australia in the 1800s.

Irish immigration helped shape Australian culture and society and continues to influence contemporary Australia. We have established this Scholarship at WSU to remember past famine experiences by supporting a current female refugee who sought sanctuary and solace in our country, by helping her to advance her education and contribute to Australia as previous Irish emigrants have done.

Since 2009 we have raised sufficient funds to enable an annual prize of \$1000 to be awarded to a worthy student chosen by WSU. In 2018 and again in 2019, we have also provided Scholarships to refugee students to the value of \$7500 each. In 2018, the scholarship assisted Negar Zarei to complete her Degree in Nursing.

Mamre Programmes

The Great Irish Famine Commemoration Committee also raise funds in support of Mamre Programmes which were initially established by the Sisters of Mercy at Mamre Homestead, St Marys, NSW. This venture supports African refugees, especially those from Southern Sudan. The programme runs classes for women in English language, computer skills, social and life skills, women's health, food and nutrition. A creche operates to care for young children while their mothers attend classes. Gardening skills and fresh vegetable production are also Mamre enterprises.
